

Strangulation in the context of Intimate Partner Violence

OVERVIEW

Strangulation is recognised as a significant red flag predicting future serious harm for victims of domestic violence. And yet the consequences of strangulation go largely unrecognised by law enforcement, health professionals, advocates and victims. New legislation is currently before parliament that will make strangulation a specific crime, and with that there are opportunities to increase knowledge and understanding throughout our communities.
