Supplementary data: Regional data by Police District

This supplementary data contains a breakdown of Family Violence Investigations and Police Safety Orders Issued and Breached by Police District.¹

Please note that as with any administrative data, NZ Police figures for family violence investigations are not suitable as a proxy indicator of prevalence of family violence. They reflect instances where Police decided to undertake an investigation involving an assessment of the risk of family violence occurring. Police may undertake such investigations for a variety of reasons relating to one of more offence or non-offence incidents involving family violence having occurred or the potential of family violence occurring in the future.¹

Family violence investigation statistics are based on data drawn from a dynamic operational database. They are subject to change as new information is continually recorded. Caution should therefore be observed when making inferences from these data.¹

For a detailed discussion of the process for collecting data, changes over time and the uses of government agency data for understanding community experiences of family violence, see *Family Violence Indicators* (2013).²

All numbers in the tables are rounded to the nearest whole number unless otherwise stated. Percentages may not add up to 100 due to rounding.


